① Propósito ② Requisitos ③ Evaluación	① This course is designed as an introduction to the analysis of Anglo-Saxon vernacular texts. Although the linguistic code of the period will be studied both in a general and a practical way, the emphasis of the course will be laid on helping the student get a first-hand knowledge of the language itself as it has been preserved in the documents and literary works which have come down to us. The historical and cultural contexts in which the texts were produced will be also taken into account.					
	② To fully benefit from this course, it is advisable, though not compulsory, to simultaneously attend or to have attended the classes on the History of the English Language I. An adequate command of both written and oral English will be required in order to follow and pass this course.					
	③ Students will be graded according to the quality and regularity of their course work and the results of written tasks and a final exam. Appropriate use of language in exercises, assignments and exams will be required. Serious deficiencies in that respect will not grant a pass. Failure to attend classes regularly will seriously affect the final mark.
