① Propósito ② Evaluación	<p>① One objective of the Instrumental Module is to promote the student's ability in the four skills in this language: listening, speaking, writing and reading to reach a level of B1+, following the Council of Europe <i>Common European Framework of Reference</i> (<a href="http://www.coe.int/t/dg4/Linguistic/Source/Framework_EN.pdf">http://www.coe.int/t/dg4/Linguistic/Source/Framework_EN.pdf</a>). In Spanish: <a href="http://cvc.cervantes.es/obref/marco">http://cvc.cervantes.es/obref/marco</a>). This includes improving your knowledge of the structures, vocabulary, etc. of the English language. A further, important, objective is to increase the student's capacity as an autonomous learner through work done during the semester. A third objective is to be able to work in the Moodle learning environment to improve the listed skills and your learning autonomy.</p> <p>Because this subject has been part of the English Pilot Project, we will continue to use the class schedule set up. Students will be informed of how this will affect our working method at the beginning of the course.</p> <p>② The evaluation of the course is based on the results obtained in both parts of the subject (Linguistic Analysis and Instrumental), which must both be passed by the student. The assessment criteria of the Instrumental Module are:</p>				
	<p>1 Demonstration of a B1+ CEF level in spoken &amp; written work.                  2 Active participation in class. (To be further defined by students and teacher together)                  3 Written assignments satisfactorily done and handed in on required dates (CEF level B1+).                  4 Out of class work on speaking.                  5 Out of class work on new vocabulary (stories + comments &amp; corrections on Moodle platform)                  6 Improvement of learning strategies.                  7 Self-assessment on all the above points.                  8 Final exams for those students who do not fulfil the above requisites.</p> <p>The final exam consists of the following:                  WRITING: Students who have not satisfactorily done written assignments throughout the semester will have to sit a writing test. The test will be a one-page composition based on the topics covered in the fluency speaking sessions. The test will be marked for coherence and correct grammar usage (see criteria description).                  ORAL EXAM: Only for those students who have not demonstrated the required level will have to take an oral exam. This will be done in the teacher's office. The oral will be taped and students are expected to bring a blank tape.                  Parts of this module will not be saved from one 'convocatoria' to another.</p>
