Temario	① To provide an overview of variation in English including accent, dialect, register and genre ② Students should have a good command of English, both spoken and written. ③ To obtain a <u>pass grade</u> students must attend 95% of classes both practical and theoretical. Many practical classes are devoted to discussion of reading material (some of which is on the internet) and students must demonstrate that they have read this material thoroughly. In addition students undertake two tasks (see below) Students who fail to satisfy the continuous assessment criteria must sit for an examination (see below) in addition to submitting the two tasks. Tipo de pruebas teóricas o prácticas a superar: The two compulsory tasks are: 1. (In pairs) An analysis of at least three different accents of English, based on a recording which students make themselves. The results of the analysis are presented in class and this presentation forms part of the assessment for the course. 2. (Individual) An analysis of a non-standard dialect in a literary text. These analyses are also presented in class and the presentations assessed. 3. To obtain a grade higher than a pass, students must also present their analyses as written papers accompanied by the appropriate bibliography. The final examination (only for those students who do not attend class) will consist of both a written paper and a laboratory test in which students will identify a number of different accents of English justifying their answers on the basis of the phonetic evidence.
